









<b>Day 68:</b> Numbers 16-17 <i>Summary</i> : Korah leads a rebellion against Moses and Aaron, but God judges the rebels. Aaron's staff buds as a sign of his authority.
<b>Day 69:</b> Numbers 18-19 <i>Summary</i> : The duties and privileges of the priests and Levites are reaffirmed. The law of purification using the ashes of a red heifer is introduced.
<b>Day 70:</b> Numbers 20-21 <i>Summary</i> : Moses strikes the rock to bring water, but disobeys God, leading to his punishment. The Israelites begin conquering the land of Canaan, defeating several kings.
Day 71: Numbers 22-23 Summary: Balaam is summoned by King Balak to curse Israel, but God intervenes. Balaam's donkey speaks, and Balaam blesses Israel instead of cursing them.
<b>Day 72:</b> Numbers 24-25 <i>Summary</i> : Balaam continues to bless Israel. Israel later falls into idolatry and immorality, leading to a plague that is stopped by Phinehas' zealous action.
<b>Day 73:</b> Numbers 26-27 <i>Summary</i> : A second census is taken as Israel prepares to enter the Promised Land. The daughters of Zelophehad request their inheritance rights, and Joshua is appointed as Moses' successor.
<b>Day 74:</b> Numbers 28-29

*Summary:* God outlines the daily, weekly, and festival offerings that the Israelites are to bring throughout the year, emphasizing their continual worship.

	Summary: Moses begins his farewell address to Israel, recounting their

	Summary: Moses recounts Israel's victories over the kings of Og and Sihon.
	He emphasizes obedience to God's law as the Israelites prepare to enter
	Canaan.
