# Monthly READING Plan

**Month:** July 1 - 31, 2025

- Day 182:** 1 Chronicles 23-24  
*Summary:* David organizes the Levites and the priests into divisions for service in the temple, assigning their duties in worship.
- Day 183:** 1 Chronicles 25-26  
*Summary:* David appoints musicians and gatekeepers for the temple. The organization and distribution of temple responsibilities are described in detail.
- Day 184:** 1 Chronicles 27-28  
*Summary:* David organizes the military, tribal leaders, and his administration. He gives Solomon detailed plans for the temple and encourages him to follow God wholeheartedly.
- Day 185:** 1 Chronicles 29  
*Summary:* The people generously give for the construction of the temple. David offers a prayer of praise and passes the kingdom to Solomon before his death.
- Day 186:** 2 Chronicles 1-2  
*Summary:* Solomon asks for wisdom from God and begins preparing to build the temple. He makes a treaty with Hiram of Tyre for materials and skilled workers.
- Day 187:** 2 Chronicles 3-4  
*Summary:* Solomon begins construction of the temple, with a detailed description of its structure, furnishings, and the artistry involved.
- Day 188:** 2 Chronicles 5-6  
*Summary:* The Ark of the Covenant is brought into the temple, and Solomon dedicates the temple with a prayer, asking for God's blessing and favor.
- Day 189:** 2 Chronicles 7-8  
*Summary:* God responds to Solomon's prayer, promising blessings for obedience and warnings for disobedience. Solomon continues to build and expands his kingdom's influence.

# Monthly READING Plan

**Month:** July 1 - 31, 2025

**Day 190:** 2 Chronicles 9

*Summary:* The Queen of Sheba visits Solomon to test his wisdom and is impressed by his wealth and knowledge. Solomon's reign ends, and he dies after ruling for 40 years.

**Day 191:** 2 Chronicles 10-11

*Summary:* After Solomon's death, the kingdom is divided when Rehoboam refuses to lighten the burden on the people. Jeroboam leads the northern tribes in rebellion.

**Day 192:** 2 Chronicles 12-13

*Summary:* Rehoboam forsakes the law of God, leading to an Egyptian invasion. Abijah, Rehoboam's son, fights Jeroboam, and God grants him victory.

**Day 193:** 2 Chronicles 14-15

*Summary:* Asa becomes king of Judah and seeks to follow God, bringing religious reforms and trusting in God for victory over his enemies.

**Day 194:** 2 Chronicles 16-17

*Summary:* Asa's faith falters later in his reign, but his son Jehoshaphat follows God and strengthens Judah, earning the respect of surrounding nations.

**Day 195:** 2 Chronicles 18-19

*Summary:* Jehoshaphat allies with Ahab, king of Israel, to fight against Syria. Ahab dies in battle. Jehoshaphat returns to Judah and institutes further reforms.

**Day 196:** 2 Chronicles 20-21

*Summary:* Jehoshaphat wins a miraculous victory over a coalition of enemies by trusting in God. His son, Jehoram, turns away from God and brings judgment on Judah.

**Day 197:** 2 Chronicles 22-23

*Summary:* Ahaziah's reign is short, and after his death, his mother Athaliah seizes power. Joash is hidden and later crowned king as a boy, and Athaliah is overthrown.

# Monthly READING Plan

**Month:** July 1 - 31, 2025

**Day 198:** 2 Chronicles 24-25

*Summary:* Joash repairs the temple but later turns away from God, leading to his downfall. His son, Amaziah, starts well but also ends in disobedience.

**Day 199:** 2 Chronicles 26-27

*Summary:* Uzziah becomes king and leads Judah to prosperity, but he is struck with leprosy for his pride. Jotham, his son, continues his work and reigns righteously.

**Day 200:** 2 Chronicles 28-29

*Summary:* Ahaz leads Judah into idolatry and faces God's judgment. His son, Hezekiah, reforms the nation, restores temple worship, and turns the people back to God.

**Day 201:** 2 Chronicles 30-31

*Summary:* Hezekiah invites all Israel and Judah to celebrate the Passover. He further reforms worship practices and destroys idols throughout the land.

**Day 202:** 2 Chronicles 32-33

*Summary:* Hezekiah trusts God for deliverance from the Assyrians, and God miraculously saves Jerusalem. His son, Manasseh, leads Judah into idolatry but later repents.

**Day 203:** 2 Chronicles 34-35

*Summary:* Josiah, the young king, brings major reforms and restores true worship in Judah. The Book of the Law is found, and Josiah renews the covenant with God.

**Day 204:** 2 Chronicles 36

*Summary:* Judah's final kings continue in disobedience, leading to the nation's downfall. Jerusalem is destroyed, and the people are taken into exile by the Babylonians.

# Monthly READING Plan

**Month:** July 1 - 31, 2025

**Day 205:** Ezra 1-2

*Summary:* King Cyrus of Persia allows the Jews to return to Jerusalem and rebuild the temple. The exiles return, and a list of those who came back is recorded.

**Day 206:** Ezra 3-4

*Summary:* The foundation of the temple is laid amid opposition. Enemies try to stop the rebuilding, and the work halts for a time.

**Day 207:** Ezra 5-6

*Summary:* Prophets Haggai and Zechariah encourage the people to resume rebuilding the temple. King Darius supports their efforts, and the temple is completed.

**Day 208:** Ezra 7-8

*Summary:* Ezra, a scribe, leads a second group of exiles back to Jerusalem. He seeks to teach the people God's law and restore proper worship.

**Day 209:** Ezra 9-10

*Summary:* Ezra learns that many of the returned exiles have intermarried with foreigners. He prays for forgiveness, and the people repent and separate from their foreign wives.

**Day 210:** Nehemiah 1-2

*Summary:* Nehemiah, serving in the Persian court, hears about the ruined walls of Jerusalem and is distressed. He gains permission from the king to rebuild them.

**Day 211:** Nehemiah 3-4

*Summary:* The people work together to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem, despite opposition from enemies. Nehemiah encourages them to trust God and continue the work.

**Day 212:** Nehemiah 5-6

*Summary:* Nehemiah addresses economic injustice among the people, and the wall is completed despite further plots and opposition.
