



Day 305: Isaiah 3-4

Summary: Isaiah warns of the judgment that will come upon Jerusalem and Judah for their sins. However, he also promises future glory and cleansing for the faithful remnant.



Day 306: Isaiah 5-6

Summary: Isaiah condemns the sins of Judah and describes his vision of God's glory, which leads him to accept his prophetic mission with a sense of awe and humility.



Day 307: Isaiah 7-8

Summary: Isaiah prophesies to King Ahaz, warning of the threat from foreign powers but offering a sign of hope: the birth of Immanuel, meaning "God with us."



Day 308: Isaiah 9-10

Summary: Isaiah proclaims the coming of a great light for Israel, foretelling the birth of a child who will be called "Wonderful, Counsellor, The Mighty God." He also warns of coming judgment on Israel for their arrogance.



Day 309: Isaiah 11-12

Summary: Isaiah prophesies the coming of the Messiah, a shoot from the stump of Jesse, who will bring justice, peace, and the knowledge of God. A song of thanksgiving follows this promise of deliverance.

Day 310: Isaiah 13-14

Summary: Isaiah prophesies the destruction of Babylon and judgment against the nations that oppose God's people. He also foretells the eventual restoration of Israel.





Day 311: Isaiah 15-17

Summary: Isaiah gives prophecies concerning the downfall of Moab and Damascus, emphasizing that human pride and wickedness will lead to destruction.



Day 312: Isaiah 18-20

Summary: Isaiah prophesies about Ethiopia's fate, Egypt's impending judgment, and the consequences of alliances that do not trust in God.



Day 313: Isaiah 21-23

Summary: Isaiah warns of judgment on Babylon, Edom, Arabia, and Tyre, describing their fall as a result of their rebellion against God.



Day 314: Isaiah 24-25

Summary: Isaiah describes God's final judgment on the whole earth and the destruction of wickedness. He also prophesies about a future where God wipes away all tears and brings eternal joy.

Day 315: Isaiah 26-27

Summary: Isaiah offers a song of trust in God's salvation and speaks of the restoration of Israel. He promises that God will defeat Leviathan, the symbol of chaos and evil.



Day 316: Isaiah 28-29

Summary: Isaiah warns Israel and Judah of their coming judgment due to their disobedience but also promises future restoration and renewal through God's grace.





Day 317: Isaiah 30-31

Summary: Isaiah calls Judah to trust in God rather than foreign alliances. He warns of the consequences of relying on Egypt for protection instead of God.

Day 318: Isaiah 32-33

Summary: Isaiah prophesies about a future righteous king who will reign in justice. He also warns of the destruction of the enemies of God's people and promises their ultimate deliverance.

Day 319: Isaiah 34-35

Summary: Isaiah describes God's judgment on the nations, focusing on Edom's destruction. He also promises a future time of salvation and joy for God's people.



Day 320: Isaiah 36-37

Summary: King Hezekiah faces the Assyrian invasion. Isaiah encourages him to trust in God, and God miraculously delivers Judah by destroying the Assyrian army.



Day 321: Isaiah 38-39

Summary: Hezekiah falls ill but is healed after praying to God. Later, he shows Babylonian envoys his treasures, leading to Isaiah's prophecy that Babylon will one day conquer Judah.



Day 322: Isaiah 40-41

Summary: Isaiah comforts God's people by reminding them of His power, care, and faithfulness. He assures them that God will deliver them from exile and bring justice.





Day 323: Isaiah 42-43

Summary: Isaiah proclaims the coming of God's servant who will bring justice to the nations. He also reminds Israel of God's love, redemption, and promise to restore them.



Day 324: Isaiah 44-45

Summary: God declares His sovereignty over creation and history, promising to redeem Israel. He prophesies the rise of Cyrus, who will set Israel free and rebuild Jerusalem.



Day 325: Isaiah 46-47

Summary: Isaiah speaks against the idols of Babylon and foretells Babylon's fall. He emphasizes that God alone is in control of history.



Day 326: Isaiah 48-49

Summary: Isaiah calls Israel to return to God and trust in His promises. He prophesies about the servant of the Lord, who will bring salvation to Israel and the nations.



Day 327: Isaiah 50-51

Summary: Isaiah speaks of the suffering servant, who will faithfully obey God despite persecution. He encourages Israel to trust in God's salvation and His ability to deliver them.



Day 328: Isaiah 52-53

Summary: Isaiah describes the coming of the suffering servant, who will be despised, rejected, and wounded for humanity's sins. This is one of the clearest Old Testament prophecies about the Messiah's sacrificial death.





Day 329: Isaiah 54-55

Summary: God promises future blessings and restoration for Israel, emphasizing His compassion and the fulfillment of His covenant promises.



Day 330: Isaiah 56-57

Summary: Isaiah calls for justice and righteousness, warning against idolatry. He promises that all who trust in God will experience His salvation.



Day 331: Isaiah 58-59

Summary: God rebukes Israel for their empty religious practices, calling them to genuine repentance and justice. He also promises that His salvation will come to those who turn to Him.



Day 332: Isaiah 60-61

Summary: Isaiah prophesies about the future glory of Israel and the coming of the Messiah, who will bring good news to the poor, heal the brokenhearted, and proclaim liberty to the captives.



Day 333: Isaiah 62-64

Summary: Isaiah prays for the restoration of Jerusalem and the return of God's people. He pleads for God's mercy and forgiveness, recognizing their sinfulness.



Day 334: Isaiah 65-66

Summary: God promises to create a new heaven and a new earth where righteousness will dwell. Isaiah ends with a vision of ultimate judgment and salvation for all nations.
